4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Taxi driver is generally employed with a taxi firm. He/she carries passengers in a passenger car or minibus for a maximum of eight persons. The Taxi driver works independently and is responsible for the quality of his/her own work. According to the Driver's Licence Order and the Passenger Transport Bill 2000, respectively, the Taxi driver must have a valid driver's card. He must also be able to present a medical declaration and a certificate of good conduct, and have successfully passed the theory and practical driving exam.

Access to next level of education/professions The career prospects for a Taxi driver consist mainly of transfer to Coach driver, Coach driver/tour guide or Public transport driver. This requires completing supplementary components of these study courses. It is also possible within the company to advance and to switch to an office position in the form of a planning or coordinating position (planner, controller). The Taxi driver can specialise as doctor's service driver. The Taxi driver can also advance to the position Practical coach/mentor driver. 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
