### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Media designer works in a multidisciplinary project team. The team may also include the following disciplines: media management, media marketing, IT, possibly AV. The market for media is in a constant state of flux. Media products that in the past were physical have now to a large extent given way to (a constant flow of) digital media solutions via a range of channels. The Media designer is specifically responsible for the design of media for crossmedia use.

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### 5. Official basis of the certificate

## Level of the certificate (national or international)

Qualification level 4 of the Dutch VET qualification structure

Characteristics: non-job related skills such as tactical and strategic capacities. The professional bears his or her own responsibility, which is not only related to practical implementation in terms of monitoring and supervision, but also a more formal, organisational responsibility. The range of tasks also includes drafting new procedures.

NLQF-niveau 4 - EQF level 4 - ISCED 3A

### Access to next level of education/professions

For the Media designer, transfer to a related higher professional education (hbo) course is an option. There are senior secondary vocational education (mbo) institutions that have entered into agreements with hbo education institutions for smooth transition processes. Many design-based hbo education courses are subject to admission testing. Promotion to positions at hbo education level are also possible via work experience. The job content remains the same, but at hbo education level.

### International agreements

Media designer is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

### Legal basis

Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 25633 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of 01-08-2020.

### 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

# Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate

4 years (6400 study hours) (depending on previous education)

### **Entry requirements**

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

### 7. Additional information

Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
