The most important duties of an Audiology technician are:

Core task 1: Carries out audio logical investigations and functional diagnosis

- 1.2 Assesses referral data
- 1.3 Carries out otoscopic inspection
- 1.4 Carries out screening investigation
- 1.5 Carries out basic audio metrical investigation
- 1.6 Carries out supplementary audio metrical investigation
- 1.7 Formulates a rehabilitation plan

Core task 2: Carries out technical audio logical rehabilitation

- 2.1 Makes ear prints
- 2.2 Makes earplugs for swimming
- 2.3 Fits earplugs, hearing protection and earplugs for swimming
- 2.4 Adjusts hearing aids
- 2.5 Installs other audio logical apparatus
- 2.6 Supervises the client and surroundings during rehabilitation
- 2.7 Provides aftercare
- 2.8 Evaluates the rehabilitation
- 2.9 Writes the final report

Core task 3: Repairs audio logical apparatus

- 3.1 Seeks out malfunctions in apparatus
- 3.2 Carries out minor repairs
- 3.3 Takes care of external repairs

Core task 4: Gives audio logical advice

- 4.1 Gives advice about audio logical aids
- Gives advice about prevention of hearing damage
- Gives information to groups
- Registers and delivers the sale

Characteristics: non-job related skills such as tactical and strategic capacities. The professional bears his or her own responsibility, which is not only related to practical implementation in terms of monitoring and supervision, but also a more formal, organisational responsibility. The range of tasks also includes drafting new procedures.

Access to next level of education/professions

It is possible that the Audiology technician works as a self-employed entrepreneur or as a branch manager. In addition, via additional training it is possible to be promoted to auditory expert at the level of higher vocational education. For instance, via the higher vocational education programme of Audiology bachelor.

International agreements

The profession of Audiology technician is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

Legal basis

Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 91580 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2009.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the

Entry requirements
