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<p>Access to next level of education/professions The most obvious opportunity for advancement for the Car damage repair mechanic is to Skilled Car damage repair mechanic or Skilled car damage repair technician. The Car damage repair mechanic can also advance to these positions after several years' work experience on the labour market. If the Car damage repair mechanic has the required competences, further advancement is possible to managerial positions, such as head of the damage repair department, workshop head or even company manager. The Car damage repair mechanic can continue his career outside the sector; for example in commercial or technical positions at suppliers/manufacturers of tools or in education (as car damage repair mechanic teacher).</p>	<p>International agreements</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi).</p> <p>In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.</p> <p>In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</p>	<p>2 years (3200 study hours) (depending on previous education)</p>
<p>Entry requirements The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.</p>	

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications.
