The most important duties of a Footwear consultant are:

Core task 1: Gives advice and sells footwear and (footwear) articles

- 1.1 Inventories the need
- 1.2 Gains and assesses the data
- 1.3 Chooses and fits shoes
- 1.4 Advises the client
- 1.5 Completes the sale
- 1.6 Deals with complaints

Core task 2: Carries out foot investigation

- 2.1 Assesses the feet
- 2.2 Makes a foot print
- 2.3 Interprets and registers the data

Core task 3: Carries out small adjustments to mass-produced footwear

- 3.1 Makes appointments with the client
- 3.2 Carries out adjustments to the inner sole, foot bed or uppers
- 3.3 Has adjustments carried out to the soles

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Footwear consultants work in specialty shoe shops with a focus on fit and comfort. Customers usually seek these shops out.

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5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE	
Qualification level 4 of the Dutch VET qualification structure Characteristics: non-job related skills such as tactical and strategic capacities. The professional bears his or her own responsibility, which is not only related to practical implementation in terms of monitoring and supervision, but also a more formal, organisational responsibility. The range of tasks also includes drafting new procedures. <b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The Footwear consultant can develop into self-employed entrepreneur. He can choose to start his own business, or move on up to the position of business manager/branch manager. If the Footwear consultant wishes to continue to grow, he can do additional training in the field of podology, podopostoral therapy, and orthopaedic footwear technology.	<b>International agreements</b> The profession of Footwear consultant is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.
<b>Legal basis</b> Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 94681 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2009.	

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

<b>Entry requirements</b> The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
