4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE
<p>The Decorating plasterer carries out his work in a variety of buildings and rooms/spaces. The work involves new building and maintenance. He applies specialist decorative plasterwork. The Decorating plasterer above all works individually but can work as a part of a team. He is employed at ever changing, often unique locations. He may be employed both indoors and outdoors.</p>

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<p>Access to next level of education/professions The Decorating plasterer can progress to the non-funded study course restoration plasterer (Master certificate Restoration plasterer). He can also advance to a (middle) management position or a specialist position at higher professional education level (technical consultant, teacher).</p>	<p>International agreements The profession of Decoration plasterer is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>

<p>Entry requirements The certificate senior secondary vocational education (mbo) on qualification level 3, in a related discipline.</p>	

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
