3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Skilled mechanic service and maintenance mechanical engineering are:

Core task 1: Inspects equipment, installations, and systems

- 1.1 Prepares inspection of equipment, installations and systems
- 1.2 Takes precautions for inspection working duties
- 1.3 Performs sensory inspection of equipment, installations and systems
- 1.4 Performs measurements and tests on equipment, installations and systems
- 1.5 Makes an initial diagnosis and report results
- 1.6 Rounds off inspection work on equipment, installations and systems

Core task 2: Optimises equipment, installations, and systems corrects malfunctioning.

- 2.1 Does preparatory work for troubleshooting and optimisation of equipment, installations and systems
- 2.2 Takes precautionary measures for troubleshooting and optimisation of equipment, installations and systems
- 2.3 Disassembles, modifies, repairs and assembles components of equipment, installations and systems
- 2.4 Checks and tests work performed on equipment, installations and systems
- 2.5 Delivers equipment, installations and systems
- 2.6 Rounds off maintenance and modification work

Core task 3: Locates malfunctioning which can be simple in the engineering part of the equipment, installations, and systems.

- 3.1 Does preparatory work for locating malfunctions in the mechanical component of equipment, installations and systems
- 3.2 Locates and analyses (simple) malfunctions in the mechanical component of equipment, installations and systems
- 3.3 Adjusts the mechanical component of equipment, installations and systems and fine tunes it
- 3.4 Supervises less experienced colleagues

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4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

A Skilled mechanic service and maintenance mechanical engineering works for industrial companies and supplying industries of semi-manufactured products, manufactured products, products, and semi-finished products, such as the metal fabrication industry, machinery sector, equipment construction companies, transport equipment industry, food sector, luxury foods, petrochemical industry, chemical industry, wood industry, and paper industry. It could involve both small and large companies. If he works for one of these companies, he will be employed by the technical service or on the department service and maintenance. He could also work for a service provider that will be hired for service and maintenance purposes. In that case he deals with a diversity of customers. The Skilled mechanic service and maintenance mechanical engineering carries out maintenance on the engineering part of the installations and performs simple work on the electro technical part of it. He locates technical failures which may be simple and very local and corrects these and carries out repairs and modifications.

He could expand his knowledge for professions such as a Skilled mechanic service and maintenance engineering installations, or a skilled mechanic service and maintenance gas turbines.</p>	<p>International agreements The profession of Skilled mechanic service and maintenance mechanical engineering is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).
In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.
In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate

3 years (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science.
