4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The work of the Precision machinist is generally carried out in a special workshop in the company. The work can also be performed under special conditions, such as in conditioned rooms, 'clean room'.

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5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Qualification level 3 of the Dutch VET qualification structure</p> <p>Characteristics: implementation of more than just the own block of tasks. The professional is able to account for his or her actions towards colleagues, and monitors and supervises the work of others. <p>Access to next level of education/professions</p> <p>The certificate of Precision machinist gives access to a middle-management or specialist programme (qualification level 4).</p> <p>Within the field of precision engineering, the Precision machinist can move up to research instrument maker, planner or he can broaden his expertise in the direction of precision machinist. Through work experience he can also develop into contributing manager or specialist in the field of precision engineering.</p>	<p>International agreements</p> <p>The profession of Precision machinist is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>
<p>Legal basis</p> <p>Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 94352</p> <p>The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2008.</p>	

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).</p> <p>In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.</p> <p>In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</p>	<p>3 year(s) (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)</p>
<p>Entry requirements</p> <p>The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.</p>
