3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Pedicurist are:

Core task 1: Carry out a basic pedicure treatment

- 1.2 Makes treatment plan Carries out treatment

- 1.4 Provides advice and promotes the sale of products/services
- 1.5 Evaluates and finishes off treatment

Core task 2: Preparing for entrepreneurship

2.1 Prepares the launch of the company (sole proprietorship)

2.2 Prepares for business operations

2.3 Prepares for the promotion of the company

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The majority of the Pedicurists practises their profession as a sole proprietor. She has her own company or works ambulatory. The Pedicurist could be employed by a company. Possible work environments are: pedicure company, beauty farm, medical pedicure centre, health care centre, pharmacy or perfumery.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE		
Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the		
training on the job pathway (bbl).		
In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course c	onsists of theory at school. The extent of the practical	

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
