3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Shoe repairman 3 are:

Core task 1: Prepares and processes leather

- 1.2 Applies fasteners
- 1.3 Maintenance of workplace and tools

Core task 2: Repairs leather products and leather ware

- 2.1 Performs preparatory work
- 2.2 Repairs and finishes leather products/leather goods

Core task 3: Advises and sells

- 3.1 Assesses the (reparation)requirement
- 3.2 Assesses and gives advice about the repair
- 3.3 Advises about leather goods and products and its by-products
- 3.4 Registers and completes sale/ repair
- 3.5 Deals with complaints
- 3.6 Presents articles

Core task 4: performs specialist jobs on shoes

- 4.1 Wipes down the shoe mechanically or manually
- 4.2 Widens and narrows shanks
- 4.3 Carries out adjustments to mass-produced footwear
- 4.4 Repairs orthopaedic shoes

Core task 5: Sets up or runs a freelance company/sole proprietorship

- 5.1 Defines the future image of the company

The Shoe repairman 3 works mostly in small companies comprising one to a maximum of several employees. He is an entrepreneur. The Shoe repairman 3 repairs shoes and leather goods and returns them as much as possible into their original condition in order to keep the fit, model, functionality, and quality.

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<p>Access to next level of education/professions The Shoe repairman could, if he is self-employed, decide to set up or take over several branches. If the Shoe repairman 3 obtains additional certificates or degrees, he could specialise in performing repairs on orthopaedic shoes and apply orthopaedic and shoe technical provisions. In addition, the Shoe repairman 3 could follow the course in Made-to-measure shoe maker.</p>	<p>International agreements The profession of Shoe repairman is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).
In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.
In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate

3 years (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
