<b>4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE</b>
<p>The Assistant construction, living and maintenance worker helps to build, maintain or keep buildings and outdoor spaces in liveable condition. Work is often carried out on location, indoors and outdoors.</p>

<b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The Assistant construction, living and maintenance worker can in principle enter all study courses at level 2. The Assistant construction, living and maintenance worker who wishes to progress in the same field can advance within construction and infrastructure to a variety of professions at the level of basic professional practitioner. In the painting sector, there are transfer opportunities to the level of basic professional practitioner in the field of painting and industrial paint processing. In the construction finishing sector, transfer is possible to the level of basic professional practitioner as plasterer, floor layer or wall/ceiling mechanic. In waste management and public space management, a certificate holder can advance to the level of basic professional practitioner in the sector. In the wood industry there are transfer opportunities to the level of basic professional practitioner as furniture maker, (ships) interior builder, furnishings/project upholsterer, assembler carpenter industry or machine operator wood working.	<b>International agreements</b>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbj). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.	
<b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b>	<b>1 year (1600 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b>
<b>Entry requirements</b> There are no legal educational requirements.	

## 7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
