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OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE

Level of the certificate (national or international)

Qualification level 4 of the Dutch VET qualification structure

Characteristics: non-job related skills such as tactical and strategic capacities. The professional bears his or her own responsibility, which is not only related to practical implementation in terms of monitoring and supervision, but also a more formal, organisational responsibility. The range of tasks also includes drafting new procedures.

Access to next level of education/professions

With a Fashion designer diploma, transfer is possible to higher vocational education, for example to: a 4-year fulltime study programme as fashion designer specialising in 'Textile concept development' (Royal Academy for Visual Arts in The Hague), a 2-year part-time study programme in Styling and Fashion Design specialisation in 'interior styling' (Artemis), a 4-year fulltime fashion study programme specialising in 'design' or 'management' (AMFI) or a 3.5-year higher professional education study programme training candidates for commercial management positions in the fashion and lifestyle sector (TMO Doorn).

International agreements

Fashion designer is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

Legal basis

Adult and Vocational Education Act (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 25687 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2021.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
