## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of an All-round machine operator wood working are:

Core task 1: Processes wood using machines

- 1.1 Prepares machine working duties
- 1.2 Carries out simple maintenance
- 1.3 Assembles production data
- 1.4 Selects, inspects and transports wood and sheet materials
- 1.5 Applies and adjusts cutting tools
- 1.6 Adjusts wood processing machines
- 1.7 Carries out test process
- 1.8 Carries out processes using wood processing machines
- 1.9 Clears up the workplace

Core task 2: Supervising the department mechanical wood working

- 2.1 Supervises and instructs
- 2.2 Monitoring production process

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The All-round machine operator wood working works on the mechanical department of a company in the wood processing industry. He works for both big and small companies. Many of the large series-produced companies in the furniture industry are specialised, for instance in cupboards, tables, counters, kitchens or (ship)panelling. Next to this, there are interior companies which manufacture shop interior and office interior. Window frames, wooden windows and doors are made primarily on the mechanical department of carpentry factories.

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5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE	
Qualification level 3 of the Dutch VET qualification structure Characteristics: implementation of more than just the own block of tasks. The professional is able to account for his or her actions towards colleagues, and monitors and supervises the work of others. The range of tasks also includes drafting work preparation procedures. <b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The most logical step for the All-round machine operator wood working is to become an assistant manager or planning officer (level 4).	<b>International agreements</b> The profession of All-round machine operator wood working is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.
<b>Legal basis</b> Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 95570 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2011.	

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.	
<b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b>	<b>4 years (6400 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b>
<b>Entry requirements</b> The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
