3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of an All-round beautician are:

Core task 1: To carry out a basic beauty treatment

- 1.1 Receives the client and prepares treatment
- 1.2 Carries out facial treatment
- 1.3 Carries out hand, nail and foot treatments
- 1.4 Carries out body treatment
- 1.5 Completes the treatment and sells additional products/services

Core task 2: Preparing for sole proprietorship

- 2.1 Prepares the launch of the company (sole proprietorship)
- 2.2 Prepares for business operations
- 2.3 Prepares for the promotion of the company

Core task 3: To carry out a specialist beauty treatment

- 3.1 Carries out an additional beauty treatment
- 3.2 Carries out an acne treatment
- 3.3 Performs a skin-enhancing massage
- 3.4 Performs a cosmetic massage using the Shiatsu method

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Most All-round beauticians carries out her profession as a sole trader. She owns her own company or works as an ambulant beautician. She could however work as a manager for a company. Possible working environments include: a beauty salon, wellness centre, sauna, pharmacy or perfumery. The All-round beautician carries out specialist and complex treatments.

Access to next level of education/professions

An All-round beautician has the following growth opportunities: becoming an educational trainer, expanding with wellness based and specialist treatments, and expanding her entrepreneurship. She could be transferred to qualifications such as Medical pedicure and salon manager. She could also follow further education at a university of applied sciences (hbo). The hbo courses skin therapy and physiotherapy reflect the qualification all-round beautician mostly in terms of contents. Following other hbo courses is also an option.

International agreements

The profession of All-round beautician is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

Legal basis

Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 25403 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2015.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
