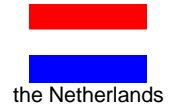

### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Sign specialist is on the payroll or employed as an independent entrepreneur for a company in the sign sector or engraving sector or for another company with a department sign. These are service companies which take care of the communication for all sorts of sectors. The Sign specialist could also work on commission for advertising agencies, architects or window shop agencies. The Sign specialist carries out working duties involving the execution, production, finish and/or assembling of (part) products. He carries out his working duties for different clients.

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<p><b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The Sign specialist could be transferred to Higher Vocational Education (hbo) and study design. The Sign specialist can be promoted to the position of a project leader, manager or head of the department of middle size and large companies. Another transfer possibility for the Sign specialist is sole proprietorship.</p>	<p><b>International agreements</b> The profession of Sign specialist is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

## 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

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### Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

## 7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
