3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Social pedagogical carer are:

The Social pedagogical carer is trained to offer assistance and counselling to children from new-born through to young adult (adolescent), in a wide range of specialist fields in respect of child-raising situations. The Social pedagogical carer is responsible for the planning and implementation of pedagogical counselling and supervision. During the course of training, the participant is required to opt for a specialisation child day care, care for the disabled or primary education. In child day care and primary education, the development of children is promoted through the organisation of specially-adapted activities. In care for the disabled, day-to-day care and meaningful daytime activities and a pleasant residential climate receive attention.

The compulsory subqualifications are:

- Method-based Skills 1;
- Social Skills;
- Organisational Skills 1;
- Professionalism and Quality Assurance;
- Individual and Society;
- Man, Work and Society;
- English 2;
- Care;
- Supervision/Counselling SPW 3.

In addition, a choice must be made from the compulsory elective components:

- child day care;
- care for the disabled
- primary education.

The free choice component comprises subqualifications for further transfer.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Depending on the selected specialisation, the Social pedagogical carer can be employed as a group leader in child day care, teaching assistant in primary education or group leader in care for the disabled.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>
