- 1.3 Sets up and puts away articles at jewellers' on a daily basis

Core task 2: Sells and advises

- 2.1 Sells jewellery articles
- 2.2 Designs new jewellery articles
- 2.3 Gives an indication of the value of jewellery, precious stones, clocks and watches and articles of use
- 2.4 Receives and deals with complaints
- 2.5 Completes sales and advice
- 2.6 Prevents crime

Core task 3: Takes care of repair work

- 3.1 Advises about repairs
- 3.2 Registers repairs and determines who should carry out the repair
- 3.3 Carries out repairs
- 3.4 Manages goldsmith/ silversmith/ clock and watch technician

Core task 4: Provides professional skills for the benefit of their business

- 4.1 Starts up and gives form to a jewellery business

- 4.3 Promotes and profiles the jewellery business

<p>Access to next level of education/professions The Jeweller can start his own business, within a chain store or within larger businesses; he can be promoted to managerial positions. The Jeweller may do an additional higher vocational education for this, such as the Higher business school programme management, Economics and law, the higher vocational education programme for Small business and the higher vocational education programme for Retail management.</p>	<p>International agreements The profession of Jeweller is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.
