### 3. Profile of skills and competences

The most important duties of an All-round water sports industry worker are:

Core task 1: Carries out working duties on leisure vessels

- 1.1 Performs service- and repair work to the exterior of leisure vessels
- 1.2 Performs service- and repair work to propulsion systems
- 1.3 Performs service- and repair work to on-board systems
- 1.4 H Hoists leisure vessels and jacks them up
- 1.5 Cruises in and around the harbour

Core task 2: Maintains the premises and the facilities

- 2.1 Performs maintenance work on the premises and facilities
- 2.2 Performs simple repair work on the premises and facilities

Core task 3: Manages the inventory and maintains the material

- 3.1 Maintains the inventory
- 3.2 Performs maintenance work on machines, hand tools and materials

Core task 4: Receives and advises customers/guests

- 4.1 Advises and rents out/sells products and/or services
- 4.2 Signals and processes complaints
- 4.3 Performs simple repair work on the premises and facilities

### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The All-round water sports industry worker is employed in the water sports industry. The Dutch water sports industry involves primarily design, construction, yacht harbours, repairs and maintenance, yacht brokers, retail trade and recreation.

### 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

### **Entry requirements**

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
