3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important tasks of a Network manager include network management, solving system disruptions and managing central data such as customer data. The Network manager lays down rules for the use of central data and for the use of other sources such as printers. He/she is responsible for smooth harmonisation between the technical components and the users. The Network manager also periodically tests whether all networks are still running smoothly and whether the capacity of the system components is still sufficient.

The Network manager has technical knowledge and skills and is able to explain the use of the network to colleagues. The Network manager remains up to date on the rapidly changing developments in the field.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Network manager in small and medium-sized enterprises, service organisations.

Access to next level of education/professions With a diploma at qualification level 4, transfer is possible to higher professional education (hbo), for example to the hbo course Information services and management.	International agreements Network manager is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.
