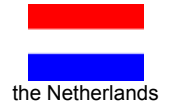

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<b>3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES</b>
<p>The most important duties of a Skilled bodywork builder are:</p> <p>Core task 1: Carries out assembly tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.1 Prepares and monitors the implementation</li> <li>1.2 Gathers materials and tools and furnishes the workplace and prepares the object to be assembled</li> <li>1.3 Assembles components/systems and mounts on vehicles</li> <li>1.4 Monitors the work and finalises the job</li> </ul> <p>Core task 2: Constructs, repairs and maintains body works and installations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2.1 Determines method of repair/ maintenance</li> <li>2.2 Carries out working duties on chassis</li> <li>2.3 Carries out working duties on bodywork construction</li> <li>2.4 Carries out working duties on vehicle installations</li> </ul>

<b>4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE</b>
<p>A Skilled bodywork builder can work in production or repair/maintenance in the mobility sector. He works in companies which specialise in (re)building and maintaining/repairing various vehicles, such as (luxury) personal vehicles, two-wheeled vehicles (motorcycles, scooters, mopeds and bicycles), recreational vehicles (caravans, pop-up campers) and/or company vehicles. Furthermore he can also work at companies working in bodywork construction.</p>

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<p><b>Access to next level of education/professions</b>            A Skilled bodywork builder can develop through educations on their current level within the bodywork sector, i.e. Skilled caravan mechanic, Skilled car damage repair mechanic, Skilled car damage mechanic or Skilled car spray painter. He can also develop through VET-level 4 qualifications, such as Technical manager or Technical draughting.            If the Skilled bodywork builder possesses the required skills, further development to supervising functions is possible, such as construction or maintenance supervisor, workplace supervisor or even company manager. A Skilled bodywork builder can also continue his career outside his sector; in commercial or technical functions at caravan mechanism suppliers and manufacturers or education (as a teacher of bodywork construction).</p>	<p><b>International agreements</b>            The profession of Skilled bodywork builder is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi).</p> <p>In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.</p> <p>In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p><b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b></p>	<p><b>3 years (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b></p>
<p><b>Entry requirements</b>            The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.</p>	

## 7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
