#### 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of an All-round assistant audio-visual production are:

Core task 1: Produces and adjusts light, image and/or sound

- 1.1 Gathers AV material and equipment, constructs it and takes it down after completion
- 1.2 Tests AV equipment and fine-tunes it
- 1.3 Optimises the shooting location and/or styles the design and décor
- 1.4 Operates AV equipment during productions and recordings
- 1.5 Selects takes for the processing and/or editing
- 1.6 Revises and/or edits takes

Core task 2: Maintains and manages audiovisual materials and apparatus

- 2.1 Checks audiovisual material and apparatus and carries out simple maintenance
- 2.2 Manages the archive

Core task 3: Carries out maintenance tasks

- 3.1 Gathers location information
- 3.2 Interprets the scenario
- 3.3 Uses and registers the user rights

#### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

An All-round assistant audio-visual production works for broadcasts, audio-visual and integrated media producers, publishers and advertising agencies, photo studios, (private) consumers, governmental institutions and facility companies among others. An All-round assistant audio-visual production can work under a steady contract, temporary contract or as an independent entrepreneur.

# 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 25193

The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2015.

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

#### **Entry requirements**

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
