The Animal care worker cares for animals in their living environment; this may be a zoo, shelter, kennel, breeding facility for companion animals, dog walking service, specialist pet store, petting farm, trial farm or practice where (bio)medical services are provided.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications.
