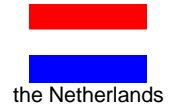

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3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES
<p>The most important duties of an ICT worker are:</p> <p>Core task 1: Installs and maintains hardware, software and connections</p> <p>1.1 Preparing for use systems, peripherals and applications</p> <p>1.2 Replacement, repair and/or (dis)assembly of systems and peripherals</p> <p>1.3 Realisation of connections</p> <p>Core task 2: Treats incident reports</p> <p>2.1 Working and registering of incidents</p> <p>2.2 Resolves and/or escalates incidents</p>

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE
<p>An ICT worker works at or for companies working with ICT. This means the work area is quite large. The ICT worker can work at a small, medium-sized or large company, be it profit or non-profit, (commercial) enterprises, but also (semi-) governmental institutions.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</p>	<p>2 years (3200 study hours) (depending on previous education)</p>
<p>Entry requirements The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.</p>

<p>Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications.
