## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Dental technician/manager crowns and bridges are:

Core task 1: Carries out preparatory working duties for the technical dental provisions to be made

- 1.1 Carries out entry controls
- 1.2 Communicates with the client about technical dental working duties
- 1.3 Organises technical dental working duties

Core task 2: Carries out basic technical dental duties in order to reproduce the situation in the patient's mouth

- 2.1 Prepares basic technical dental working duties
- 2.2 Makes temporary plaster models
- 2.3 Makes individual impression moulds
- 2.4 Makes permanent plaster models
- 2.5 Makes bite plates and assembles registration equipment
- 2.6 Assembles plaster models in articulator
- 2.7 Inspects and registers basic technical dental equipment

Core task 3: Supervises dental technicians in their work

- 3.1 Divides up technical dental working duties and instructs colleagues
- 3.2 Inspects and adjusts the manufacture of technical dental provisions
- 3.3 Supervises, motivates and stimulates technical dental assistants

Core task 4: Makes crowns and bridges

- 4.1 Prepares the manufacture of crown and bridge work
- 4.2 Models full, diagnostic or reduced crown and bridge work
- 4.3 Translates models into permanent restoration materials
- 4.4 Makes crown and bridge work using CAD/CAM
- 4.5 Determines the colour by the patient
- 4.6 Places tooth-coloured crown and bridge material
- 4.7 Inspects and registers crown and bridge work

Core task 5: Provides professional skills for the benefit of their business

- 5.1 Starts up a technical dental business

### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Dental technician/manager crowns and bridges works in an independently established technical dental business or in a business that is part of a collaborative partnership. The business can also be affiliated to a dentist's or a practice for dental prosthetics.

<b>Name and status of the body awarding the certificate</b> The certificate issued on completion of the programme is signed by the examination board at the school where the pupil attended the programme.	<b>Name and status of the national/regional authority providing accreditation/recognition of the certificate</b> Ministry of Education, Culture and Science
<b>Level of the certificate (national or international)</b> Qualification level 4 of the Dutch VET qualification structure Characteristics: non-job related skills such as tactical and strategic capacities. The professional bears his or her own responsibility, which is not only related to practical implementation in terms of monitoring and supervision, but also a more formal, organisational responsibility. The range of tasks also includes drafting new procedures. <b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The Dental technician/manager crowns and bridges can broaden in the field of dental prostheses. He can do the programme for Dental technician/manager prosthetics.	<b>International agreements</b> The profession of Dental technician/manager crowns and bridges is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.
<b>Legal basis</b> Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 94723 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2009.	

### 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).  
In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

## 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

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### Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.
