## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of an Afro hairdresser are:

Core task 1: Cuts and razor cuts the hair

- 1.2 Makes up or adjusts a treatment plan and prepares treatment
- 1.3 Cares for the hair and the scalp
- 1.4 Cuts and razor cuts

Core task 2: Styles hair

- 2.1 Makes up or adjusts a treatment plan and prepares treatment
- 2.2 Cutting long hair
- 2.3 Blow-drying and styling
- 2.4 Temporary styling
- 2.5 Permanent styling
- 2.6 Relaxen
- 2.7 Weaven
- 2.8 Selling and advising about products and services

Core task 3: Colours and bleaches hair

- 3.1 Makes up or adjusts a treatment plan and prepares treatment
- 3.2 Colours and bleaches hair
- 3.3 Completes treatment and brings administration up-to-date

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

An Afro hairdresser works primarily in hair salons which are focused on a specific target group, namely customers with Afro hair or black hair. Afro hairdressers may also work in other types of hairdresser's: specialised ladies' hairdressers, specialised barbers, mixed hairdressers, and specific hairdressers. There are also travelling hairdressers: hairdressers who go to the customer's home.

<p><b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> The Afro hairdresser can be promoted to a manager, entrepreneur, manager of the salon, teacher or educational instructor. The level 4 qualification Hairdresser offers an optimal and specific preparation for an entrepreneurship within the hairdressing sector. Within the sector beauty care, horizontal promotion is possible to the qualifications of Pedicurist or Beautician based on a completely obtained diploma Afro hairdresser.</p>	<p><b>International agreements</b> The profession of Afro hairdresser is not regulated in the Netherlands. However the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>																				
<p><b>Legal basis</b> Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 95741 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of August 1, 2012.</p>																					

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p><b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b></p>	<p><b>3 years (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b></p>
<p><b>Entry requirements</b> The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.</p>
